Cogeneration

At a time when Europe's agenda is dominated by financial and economic crisis, cogeneration offers European and national policy-makers and businesses an opportunity to make a significant contribution to economic growth, job creation and reduction of CO₂ emissions. Eleven per cent of Europe's electricity today is produced using cogeneration and an estimated additional 120 GWe of European cogeneration potential remains to be exploited. Cogeneration has European Union support for growth and it is generally recognised as a strategic energy choice for Europe.

COGEN Europe will celebrate its 20th anniversary this year at the upcoming **COGEN Europe Annual Conference & Dinner 2013** on 18-19 April in Brussels.
